



OVERVIEW

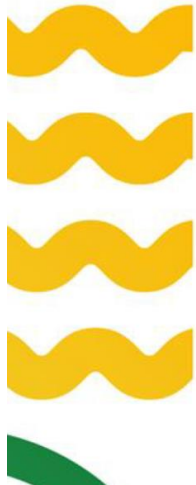
The 11th Biennial Jamaica Diaspora Conference brings together key stakeholders to advance a shared goal, building a more resilient Jamaica.
